SUMMARY OF A REVIEW HEARING - FIESTA JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP - LUKE HILTON (#32) AND GEORGE FOXLOW (#144)

HELD AT SILVERSTONE CIRCUIT RACE CONTROL; 19 AUGUST 2023, AT 1400

The meeting was opened by Andy Holley at 1358 by introducing himself, and then inviting all present to introduce themselves in turn.

He then explained the procedure for a Right of Review, quoting from the MS UK Yearbook. He emphasised the phrase that 'a significant and relevant new element is discovered'. He carried on by explaining to all present the rationale for the initial decision that was made at Knockhill, showing them the Decision Sheet from that meeting.

In particular, he read the Decision Sheet wording, in that car 32 had 'Moved across on car 144 exiting T9, causing both cars to make contact. Both cars continued. Footage was viewed from car 144; no footage was available from car 32; the live TV recording was also viewed. It was clear from the in car footage that 144 had NOT moved across to contribute to the contact.'

The race footage from You Tube of the incident was then viewed, along with the in car footage from car 144, both of which had been made available to the Clerk at the time of the decision.

Daniel Hilton pointed out that the yellow band on the steering wheel of car 144 was not exactly in the twelve o'clock position, and that possibly the commentator's reaction on the TV footage had been a little emotive.

All concerned were then shown the new element of evidence, which had been unavailable at the time of the hearing at Knockhill; two pieces of in car footage of the incident from car 32, from differing camera angles.

Luke Hilton then offered another piece of new evidence; that of in car footage from car 55, which had been following the other two cars. Andy Holley replayed the footage as requested, until all were satisfied.

Daniel Hilton felt that the incident was a racing incident, and certainly not malicious; Tim Foxlow pointed out that he had no wish for any party to be penalised.

Andy Holley summarised the incident, and using the in car footage from both car 32 and 55 (the new evidence) pointed out that car 32 had moved to the right, away from the edge of the track and into car 144.

He informed all present that he was satisfied that car 32 had caused a collision, and that the new footage actually reinforced that opinion, and at 1420

hrs all present were informed verbally that the original decision made at Knockhill on 23 July still stood.
