Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

Contact occurred between cars 32 & 98 at turn 16 resulting in car 98 retiring from the race and car 32 sustained front wing damage.

Car 32 was on the inside and we feel did everything he could to avoid the collision however decided to take to the sausage curb which pushed the car wider resulting in the contact with car 98. It is in our opinion that car 32 did not need to take to the curb and a cars width was given by car 98.

As a result of the above, car 32 is deemed to be at fault for the collision and the below penalty is cited.

Onboard footage from car 32

Interview with both drivers as well as their team representative/guardians
