Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

**Brief Details:**

Following an incident at T15 between Car 35 (Isaac Phelps) and Car 50 (Jack Taylor) both drivers with their Guardians/Team Representative were called to the Clerk of the Course. Each gave their view of the incident. Video evidence was shown to all parties. Also present were David Scott (CofC), Jon Provost (Deputy CofC) and Rob Barff (Driving Standards Advisor). The on board from Car 35 showed that contact with 50 occurred after Phelps had applied opposite lock three times with full throttle applied . Phelps (Car 35) was found fully responsible for the incident.

**Evidence Relied Upon:**

On Board video Car 35 & Car 50.
